## 18. Religion in Northern Ireland: teenagers

After meeting John Greer at a conference in New York in 1980, Leslie J Francis collaborated with Greer's pioneering research (began 1968) on the religious worldview of young people growing up in the Protestant and Catholic communities. Following Greer's death in 1994, Francis has continued to maintain Greer's sequence of studies over time.
