

23. Clergy and personality

Since the 1980s Leslie J Francis has pioneered a range of empirical studies designed to apply the insights of personality psychology to clergy. This research has employed the three dimensions of personality proposed by Eysenck and the 16 personality factors proposed by Cattell. (see also Clergy and psychological type).
