

24. Religious affiliation

The possibility of introducing a question on religion for the first time in 2001 to the census for England and Wales raised the profile of the social significance of religious affiliation (as distinct from belief or practice). As chair of the Religious Affiliates sub-group convened by the Office for National Statistics, Leslie J Francis developed both conceptual and empirical perspectives on religious affiliation.
